- Contribution: tests strategies directly targeting political economy inefficiencies

Disparity Breeds Disparity: The Impact of Racial Inequalities in Incarceration on Educational Choice (with Hoyt Bleakley)

- Approach: adjusts and calibrates the Mincer model of schooling choice for mortality and incarceration to examine the effects of premature death and imprisonment on educational investment
- Contribution: explains majority of the gap in education between Black and White men in the U.S., providing another explanation for educational disparities and an important causal pathway in the direction from incarceration to education
